



WHY THOSE CRAZY DRINK NAMES

AVE YOU EVER WONDERED how (or perhaps, why) some drinks have such crazy sounding names. One reason, of course, is that a name can determine the popularity of a drink almost as much as what's in the drink. You probably won't have trouble ordering a Parisian Blonde or Grounds for Divorce at your favorite bar but if your favorite drink is Sewer Water or Buzzard's Breath, you might have more difficulty finding a bar that promotes its Sewer Water as the best in town. And yes, Sewer Water is a real drink (its recipe is in this book.)

But where does the inspiration for such names come from? Although the origin of most cocktail drink names are unknown or based on vague legends and myths, some follow patterns. The following explains how some of our favorite drinks got their "entertaining" names.

Main ingredient

The liquor or manufacturer itself sometimes determines the name of the drink. The Bacardi cocktail, for example, was invented by the Bacardi Rum Company. The Absolut Sex shot is named after Absolut Vodka which is one of the main ingredients.

Some drinks are simply named for the main liquor used in that drink, such as Tequilla Sunrise, Vodka Tonic, Vodka Martini, Vodka Gimlet, etc.

Ingredients

Some drinks are named for the ingredients in the drink. They also may put a twist on the main liquor used such as the Sloe Comfortable Screw, that uses Southern Comfort, Sloe gin and orange juice (thus the "Sloe" and "Screw," as in Screwdriver). Then there is the spin off the Sloe Comfortable Screw Up Against a Wall, which includes Galliano (the "Wall" is short for Harvey Wallbanger that uses Galliano).

People

Several drink recipes are named for people. The Gin Rickey, for example, was named after Colonel Joe Rickey, the Negroni after Count Camillo Negroni and the Ramos Fizz named after a well know New Orleans bartender Carlos Ramos.

News stories

Some bartenders or mixologist use special events to name their new cocktails. A example is the Japanese Cocktail from the mid-1800s in honor of the first Japanese delegation to arrive in the United States. A more recent example is the Obama Mama, a drink that was advertised in several Washington D.C. area bars following the 2008 election victory for President Obama.

Places, numbers & more

The name for a drink is sometimes simply from where it originated. The classic cocktail Manhattan, for example, was named after the Manhattan Club in New York in the late 1800s where it was first served.

Another group of names are derived from sequenced numbers name or a variation of the original name. Sex On The Beach III is an example of this name.

Sexual connotations

Many drink names that have recently become popular seem to come from sexual or more adventurous names. These drinks are usually shots or shooters and include several liquors and mixes.

This of course is the category we're including in this book: Some names include Bald Pussy, Blow Job, Sex On The Beach, Leg Spreader, Dirty Red Headed Slut and other names I would like to mention but really shouldn't.

Some drinks may give you as much pleasure to say as they will to drink. These are drinks you probably should whisper to the bartender or server and then mumble later when your friends ask what you're having to drink.

You don't, for example, want to say, "I want an Ass or a Blow Job" too loudly to your server.

I have a very important tip if you do order one of these drinks or similarly named drinks:

Please don't make any snide or snickering remarks.

The bar staff has heard the remarks, jokes and comments before. On the other hand, depending on the situation, you might want to make it quite clear that you're requesting a mixed drink and not some sort of strange sexual favor from the bar staff. If not, you may end up getting some strange looks at best, or a toss out the door at the worst.

INGREDIENTS:

1 ounce(s) vodka

1 splash DeKuyper® Sour Apple Pucker schnapps

PREPARATION:

Almost-fill a shot glass with vodka.

Top off with a splash of DeKuyper's sour apple pucker.

Serve and enjoy!

♦ BALD PUSSY ♦

INGREDIENTS:

1½ shots melon liqueur

1 shot lime vodka

1 shot vodka

1 shot Triple Sec

1½ shots blueberry schnapps

1 splash lime juice

1 splash 7-Up soda

PREPARATION:

Add ice in a highball glass.

Combine ingredients in the highball glass

Shake.

♦ BEND OVER SHIRLEY ◆

INGREDIENTS:

11/2 ounce(s) raspberry vodka

4 ounce(s) lemon-lime soda

3/4 ounce(s) grenadine syrup

PREPARATION:

Fill a 12 ounce glass with cubed ice.

Add vodka and Sprite.

Top off with Grenadine.

Garnish with two Maraschino Cherries.

♦ BLOW JOB ♦

This drink is strictly for the ladies in your party and it's important that they don't use their hands to do the shot.

INGREDIENTS:

3/4 ounce(s) Irish Cream (such as Bailey's)

3/4 ounce(s) Kahlua

Top with Whipped cream

PREPARATION:

Combine Kahlua and Bailey's in a shot glass.

Top with a puff of whipped cream.

♦ BLOW JOB (#2) **♦**

INGREDIENTS:

½ ounce(s) anisette

½ ounce(s) Irish cream

PREPARATION:

Layer ingredients in a shot glass

Float Irish cream on top.

♦ BLUE BALLS ♦

INGREDIENTS:

1 ounce(s) raspberry vodka

1 ounce(s) coconut rum

1 ounce(s) Blue Curacao liqueur

PREPARATION:

Add ice to shaker

Pour one part of all three ingredients into the shaker.

Shake well and serve as double shots.

♦ BUTT SEX ♦

INGREDIENTS:

2 ounce(s) strong black coffee

1 ounce(s) vodka

1 ounce(s) triple sec

1/3 ounce(s) lemon juice

PREPARATION:

Build ingredients in coffee cup or mug.

Add whipped cream if desired.

♦ GOLDEN SHOWER #1 ♦

So many people love a Golden Shower that many variations of this drink are available. I'll include a few here for you to try.

INGREDIENTS:

1 ounce(s) vodka

1 ounce(s) orange juice

½ ounce(s) fresh lemon juice

1 splash triple sec

Ginger ale

PREPARATION:

Build all the ingredients except ginger ale in a shaker with ice.

Shake well.

Strain over ice into an old-fashioned glass.

Top with ginger ale.

Garnish with lemon slice, if desired.

♦ GOLDEN SHOWER #2 ♦

Here's another example for a Golden Shower. This one features tequila and is served as a shot.

INGREDIENTS:

1/3 ounce(s) peach schnapps

1/3 ounce(s) tequila

1/3 ounce(s) ginger ale

PREPARATION:

Pour equal portions in a small glass or large shot glass.

♦ GOLDEN SHOWER #3 ♦

Here's another example for a Golden Shower. This one also features tequila.

INGREDIENTS:

½ ounce(s) Tequila Gold (more Tequila Gold drinks)

½ ounce(s) Southern Comfort (more Southern Comfort drinks)

½ ounce(s) Galliano

2 ounce(s) Apple Juice

Lemonade

PREPARATION:

Build all the ingredients (except lemonade and Galliano) in a mixing tin

Pour over ice in a collins glass.

Top with lemonade.

Float Galliano on top.

◆ LEG SPREADER ◆

The Leg Spreader is popular at many clubs and bars. It's made a bit differently, depending on where you order the drink or to whom you're listening. (See the "Red-Headed Leg Spreader" below for a variation.)

INGREDIENTS:

1 ounce(s) Captain Morgan Spiced Rum

1 ounce(s) Malibu Coconut Rum

1 ounce(s) Peach Schnapps

2 to 3 ounce(s) Pineapple Juice

PREPARATION:

Chill a small rock glass or add ice to your glass while preparing the drink to make the glass chilled.

Build ingredients in a shaker.

Add pineapple juice. This recpipe calls for two ounces but the amount is to your personal taste but one to two ounces should be acceptable.

Add ice to the cocktail shaker and cover.

Shake well.

Strain into the chilled glass.

♦ MOUNTAIN DEW ME ◆

This drink, created by Vanessa McCormick, gets its name from its color.

INGREDIENTS:

- 2 ounce(s) Midori® melon liqueur
- 1 ounce(s) triple sec
- 4 ounce(s) pineapple juice
- 1 splash 7-Up® soda

PREPARATION:

Build all ingredients in a highball glass with ice.

Shake and serve.

Garnish with a Lime.

♦ ORGASM ♦

There are many other versions of the Orgasm. This is one is based on the phrase "An Orgasm being made on your B.A.C.K." with BACK bein an acronym for the main ingredients. You can serve an Orgasm on the rocks or layered as a shooter.

INGREDIENTS:

1 ounce(s) Bailey's® Irish cream

1 ounce(s) Amaretto

1 ounce(s) Cream (half and half)

1 ounce(s) Kahlua® coffee liqueur

PREPARATION:

Pour the liqueurs into a cocktail shaker filled with ice.

Shake well.

Strain into an old-fashioned glass filled with ice.

Fill with cream if desired.

◆ RED-HEADED LEG SPREADER ◆

Here's another version of the Leg Spreader that is popular at many clubs and bars.

INGREDIENTS:

1/4 ounce(s) Jagermeister® herbal liqueur

1/4 ounce(s) vodka

1/4 ounce(s) 1800® Tequila

1/4 ounce(s) cranberry juice

PREPARATION:

Pour all ingredients into a cocktail shaker with ice cubes.

Shake well.

Strain into a shot glass.

◆ SCREAMING ORGASM ◆

Make certain to use high quality vodka when having a Screaming Orgasm. It's possible that cheap vodka can curdle the Bailey's Irish cream. If you're uncertain of your vodka, you can test it by mixing one teaspoon each of vodka and Bailey's before making the full recipe.

INGREDIENTS:

1 ounce(s) vodka

11/2 ounce(s) Bailey's® Irish cream

½ ounce(s) Kahlua® coffee liqueur

PREPARATION:

It's important to follow the recipe carefully.

Add crushed ice to a cocktail glass.

Pour the vodka first in the cocktail glass.

Add the Bailey's,

Add the Kahlua last.

Stir.

♦ SEX ON MY FACE ♦

INGREDIENTS:

½ ounce(s) Yukon Jack® Canadian whisky

½ ounce(s) Malibu® coconut rum

½ ounce(s) Southern Comfort® peach liqueur

½ ounce(s) banana liqueur

1 splash cranberry juice

1 splash pineapple juice

1 splash orange juice

PREPARATION:

Mix in tall glass with ice.

♦ SHAVED PUSSY ♦

INGREDIENTS:

1½ oz vodka

2 oz sweet and sour mix

2 oz lemon-lime soda

Small amount of grenadine syrup (less than 1/4 ounces, for example)

PREPARATION:

Add ice to a Collins glass

Combine ingredients in a mixing glass and shake vigourously.

Pour in Collins glass

♦ SLIPPERY BALD BEAVER ◆

INGREDIENTS:

½ ounce(s) butterscotch schnapps

1 ounce(s) Bailey's® Irish cream

½ ounce(s) strawberry puree

PREPARATION:

Build ingredients in a stainless steel shaker over ice.

Shake until ice cold.

Pour into an ice-filled old-fashioned glass.

♦ SLIPPERY NIPPLE ♦

The Slippery Nipple is one of the greatest shots you can order at a bar. It's sweet to satisfy the girls and it packs a wallop to satisfy the guys. Follow these simple steps and start making these drinks on your own.

INGREDIENTS:

½ ounce(s) Bailey's® Irish cream

½ ounce(s) butterscotch schnapps

PREPARATION:

You want to not only get the appearance right for the Slippery Nipple but also be certain the flavors collide correctly with your taste buds. It's, therefore, important to make the shot correctly.

Pour the butterscotch schnapps first in the shot glass.

Slowly pour the Irish cream on top.

Top the drink off with a spurt of canned whipped cream if desired.

Serve and enjoy responsibly!

VARIATION:

Add a splash of grenadine to add a fruity twist and a color change to the Slippery Nipple.

◆ Suck, Bang & Blow! ◆

One very important note of caution with this drink is to be very careful and responsible. Even a quick look at the ingredients should suggest to you the alcholic strength of the Suck, Bang & Blow!. As with all alcohol, enjoy but drink responsibly.

INGREDIENTS:

- 1 ounce(s) Jacquin's® orange flavored gin
- 1 ounce(s) Rumple Minze® peppermint liqueur
- 2 ounce(s) Goldschlager® cinnamon schnapps
- 1 ounce(s) Jagermeister® herbal liqueur
- 3 ounce(s) Jose Cuervo® Especial gold tequila
- 1 ounce(s) Hpnotiq® liqueur
- 1 ounce(s) Smirnoff® vodka
- 1 ounce(s) Absolut® Citron vodka
- 1 ounce(s) Aristocrat® triple sec
- 1 peeled, whole lime
- 5 ounce(s) strawberry daiquiri mix
- 2 cups cranberry juice
- 1 cup sugar

PREPARATION:

Build all ingredients in a blender with ice.

Blend until smooth.

Pour into a hurricane glass.

♦ TIGHT SNATCH ◆

INGREDIENTS:

1 shot vodka

1 shot peach schnapps

Orange juice

Cranberry juice

PREPARATION:

Build all the ingredients in a highball glass.

Serve and enjoy responsibly!

VARIATION:

Try light rum instead of the vodka.
